

the mobile Education Center, it is a self-guided tour of the four primary aspects of The Education Center at The Wall – a timeline/map of the Vietnam War, a display of some of the photographs of those inscribed on The Wall, a small portion of those items left behind at The Wall, and an explanation of the legacy of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. When used without The Wall, it is not necessary to power the display unless the host desires nighttime visitation. However, in all circumstances, hosts must guarantee safe access to the display and visitors who may be standing beside the trailer reading or viewing the displays.

When used in conjunction with The Wall, a 20'x20' tent is affixed to rear passenger side of the trailer. This tent serves as the information center for The Wall containing materials, handouts, and the books used to look up locations of individual names on The Wall. The lights within the information center are powered from plugs located within the trailer. When set up on a soft surface, the exterior corners of the tent and each of its legs are staked to the ground. When set up on a hard surface, the host must provide two 50-gallon drums containing water or an equivalent amount of weight to secure the tent in cases of wind.

This tent is not to be used for volunteer coordination, check-in or other services. It is intended as a visitor center and must be maintained in a manner as to provide the best image and service to visitors to the site.

The Wall

The Wall is a half-scale replica of the memorial. It usually stands between 5'6" to 7' tall at the apex (center) and each leg reaches out 125' from that center-point. Ideally, we aim to replicate the 125° angle of The Wall, but most sites rarely can accommodate these. Depending on the angle the following rectangle is necessary. Please note, we will not place it less than 90° or more than 170°

The Wall has the ability to make up for up to 18" in slope change across the entire length. A greater change in elevation is neither aesthetically pleasing nor easy for handicapped access. The larger the elevation change, the more hosts are encouraged to hide the image of a floating wall by placing landscaping fabric beneath The Wall. Based on the foot-traffic to a site, some hosts will place pathway material down in front of The Wall. While not required, it can make it easier for handicapped access as well.

Soft Surface

On soft surface set-ups (grass and dirt) ten inch spikes are used to affix the base plates in place along the entire length of the wall. Site hosts must make certain if this will not damage irrigation or other buried utilities. In addition, near the center half of the wall, 3-5 back stakes are placed (approximately 2' deep) to keep the wall from blowing forward. Similar assurance needs to be made of no underground irrigation or utilities. If neither of these assurances can be guaranteed, the site must be treated as a "hard" set-up.

Hard Surface

In the case of parking lots, sidewalks or surfaces where stakes cannot be driven into the soil, the site host must notify VVMF no more than 90 days before the opening date. In addition, the following accommodations must be made to guarantee the safety of visitors and integrity of The Wall.

In order to maintain the placement of the base plates, 100 sand bags (each weighing no less than 25 pounds) must be used. Two are used on each base plate along the length of the wall, and two on the back braces, approximately 6' behind the wall, along the entire length. For those sand bags located in front of The Wall, site hosts will often seek black sand bags or cover them with black plastic in order to not detract from the black image of The Wall.

In lieu of the 5 stakes placed in the center half of The Wall, three to five 50-gallon barrels (filled with water or equivalent weight) to keep The Wall from blowing forward. The number and placement of these is based solely on typical wind and weather patterns. It is entirely dependent upon the judgement of the VVMF Site Manager as to their number and placement.

Power

In order to power the mobile Education Center, we need a 240 volt 50 AMP 4-wire source. This source must be located within 200' of the rear driver-driver side of the mobile education center/trailer. We have adaptors/plugs for a 4-wire hard wire (pigtailed) as well as

the traditional twist lock and standard outlet. If you have the power source, we have the cords that can plug into it.

For The Wall, we can either power that from the trailer (mobile Education Center) or from the generator. We prefer to run power for The Wall from another source. For that, we need two 20-amp 120V circuits. We prefer they not be GFCI outlets, but under most circumstances can work from GFCI plugs. We've used one circuit in the past, but I recently met with an electrician, and he has recommended we change to two circuits.

Please keep in mind if you have a generator located in a high traffic area, we carry limited coverage for cords. Usually, we will place the generator at the front of the truck/trailer and run the 240-volt cord beneath the truck/trailer. However, keep in mind, the generator will be running the entire time The Wall is open to visitors, it can detract from the ambiance of the area.

P R E S S R E L E A S E

The City of Groveland is proud to be the final city to showcase The Wall That Heals during its 2016 tour.

The Wall That Heals will arrive the morning of December 7, escorted by a large motorcade of patriotic veterans from across the nation. Once set up for display, it will be open to all, free of charge, 24 hours each day of its visit until 2:00pm December 11, when another flag waving motorcade will escort it safely out of town.

The Wall That Heals mobile exhibit features a half-scale replica of The Wall in Washington, D.C. The exterior sides of the trailer that carries The Wall That Heals open to become a mobile Education Center. Information cases display photos of service members whose names are found on The Wall, along with items left at The Wall in D.C. Since it was unveiled in 1996, it has visited more than 400 communities throughout the nation, spreading the Memorial's healing legacy to millions.

The event will allow us to pay tribute to the soldiers who fought valiantly for their country in a foreign land. These young soldiers faced horrendous odds each day to survive. Those that made it home returned to a country in turmoil where many saw them as the enemy. The Wall That Heals is truly that. It allows many of the surviving soldiers and families of those killed to finally have closure after so many years. Moreover, the mobile education center provides younger generations a glimpse into the soldier's life by showcasing displays containing images of the soldiers, their gear, and mementoes left behind at The Wall.

The City of Groveland is actively seeking donations and sponsorships for this truly amazing exhibit. Volunteers are needed for the following: opening ceremony, computer operator, security, and escort. All funds raised will be used for the VMF exhibit, travel, utilities, portable facilities, as well as security during the evening hours. Any funds raised in excess of our goal will remain in our community going to local non-profit veteran's organizations.

THE WALL THAT HEALS IS COMING TO GROVELAND, FLORIDA ON DECEMBER 7-11, 2016

*Vietnam Veterans Memorial Replica Wall and Mobile Education Center
spreads healing legacy of The Wall and educates about the impact of the Vietnam War*

WASHINGTON, D.C. – *The Wall That Heals*, a 250-foot replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, along with a mobile Education Center, is coming to City of Groveland, Florida on December 7, 2016 and arriving on City property along Crittenden Street (Behind Advance Auto Parts, 215 E. Broad Street (SR50), Groveland, FL 34736 and free to the public. *The Wall That Heals* honors the more than three million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed forces during the Vietnam War and its walls bear the names of the more than 58,000 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is the most visited memorial in our Nation's Capital, with more than four million visitors each year. However, many Americans have not been able to visit what has become known to many as "The Wall." The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund (VVMF), the organization that built The Wall, wants to give all veterans and their family members all across America an opportunity to see the Memorial.

"Taking *The Wall That Heals* on the road gives thousands more veterans and their family members an opportunity to see The Wall and honor those who have served and sacrificed so much," said Jim Knotts, CEO of VVMF. "It helps veterans from all of America's conflicts to find healing and a powerful connection through their common military experiences."

Since its debut in 1996, more than two million people have visited *The Wall That Heals* sites. It has made stops in nearly 400 U.S. communities in addition to an April 1999 tour of the Four Provinces of Ireland and a visit to Canada in 2005. Hosting *The Wall That Heals* provides a community with a multi-day experience that includes an educational experience for local schools and organizations on the history of the Vietnam era and The Wall. The exhibit includes a mobile Education Center comprised of: photos of service members whose names are found on The Wall; letters and memorabilia left at The Wall in D.C.; a map of Vietnam and a chronological overview of the conflict in Vietnam. The exhibits tell the story of the Vietnam War, The Wall and the era surrounding the conflict, and are designed to put American experiences in Vietnam in a historical and cultural context.

The Wall That Heals will be open 24 hours a day beginning December 7, 2016. There is no charge for admission. For more information, contact Rodney Lucas, CRA Liaison, (352) 429-2141, ext. 225.

About the half-scale replica

The replica Wall is approximately 250 feet in length, and like the original Memorial is erected in a chevron-shape. The replica is constructed of powder-coated aluminum, supported by an aluminum frame, and is made up of 24 individual panels, each containing six columns of names.

The names on *The Wall That Heals* replicate the names on The Wall in Washington, D.C. As on The Wall, the names are listed alphabetically by day of casualty. Beginning at the center/apex, the names start on the East Wall (right-hand side) working their way out to the end of that wing, picking up again at the far end of the West Wall (left-hand side) and working their way back in to the center/apex. Thus, the beginning and ending of the conflict are joined at the center, signifying an epoch in American history.

The Wall That Heals is transported from community to community by a 53-foot, fifth-wheel trailer with cases built into its sides, allowing it to serve as a mobile Education Center that tells the story of the Vietnam War, The Wall and the divisive era in American history.
